Propose initiatives for amendment or adoption of legislation






TOP 10 REGIONS






COPPER THEFTS

LAW ENFORCEMENT ACTION TOP 10 REGIONS




Reported 3,147 persons (+91.1% rise from 2010) of whom 1,848 were arrested (74.2% rise fromto 2010)
